## INDEPENDENT SCHOLARS DAY

September 30, 2014



Experience the sights and sounds of Middleton Place during a day dedicated to students who receive their education outside of traditional schools. Students will explore the beautiful plantation gardens; go “Beyond the Fields” to investigate the lives & culture of enslaved people at Middleton Place, as well as their contributions to Low Country culture; and visit the Plantation Stableyards where skilled artisans demonstrate jobs performed by enslaved people using the same tools and methods used during the 18th & 19th centuries. And there will be hands-on activities, too! Stableyard guides will lead students to “Meet the Breeds,” where they can interact with heritage breed animals found on the plantation, and to participate in activities including rice processing, candle making, and colonial games.

Admission is \$11.00 per student and \$12.00 per chaperon. Activities will take place from 10am-12pm and 1pm-3pm. Students and chaperons should provide their own lunches and eat at the picnic tables from 12-1pm.
